Congratulations on deciding to complete this course through Distributed Learning! Distributed Learning (DL) is a unique learning opportunity. It takes place when a student is primarily at a distance from the teacher. It is a method of instruction that relies primarily on indirect communication between students and teachers, including internet or other electronic-based delivery. All other textual resources, besides the course novel, will be provided on the D2L portal. You will receive an email from D2L once you have been enrolled in the course. Communications 12 Curriculum

Communications 12 meets the Language Arts 12 requirement for graduation in British Columbia. Students are required to write a Provincial Exam. To be eligible to write the provincial exam, all the course work must be complete and meet the learning outcomes at least two weeks prior to the exam. Students must declare their intention to write the provincial exam, in writing, to the teacher at least two weeks prior to the exam. Times and frequency for provincial exams are determined by the Ministry and students must write in a designated location to be determined in consultation with the teacher.
